GENERAL WASTE MANAGEMENT PLAN

SCOPE

R.W. LaPine, Inc. has established a "General Waste Management Plan" to control the hazards associated with waste, the proper disposal of waste, and the protection to the environment. Good housekeeping is essential for a safe and healthy worksite. Therefore, the following guidelines have been developed.

GENERAL GUIDELINES

- Prior to the start of any project discussion shall be made with Host Employers to develop a plan on how project waste will be removed. How scrap material will be staged; taking into consideration any environmental impact (i.e. drainage into sanitary, etc.)
- Employees will be made aware of the proper location and disposal method for project waste, along with the staging area of scrap material in the appropriate waste receptacles.
- If appropriate segregation of materials will be made in an effort to recycle as much material as possible. (i.e. Steel, Aluminum, Glass, all in separate containers)
- The accumulation of combustible material shall be kept at a minimum, with daily proper waste disposal.
- Materials that could rot or decay shall be disposed of daily to prevent rodents.
- Containers used on site to accumulate waste shall not be let to overflow or allow projectile material to stick out.
- The proper handling, organization, and storage of waste and scrap materials shall be done to minimize potential impact to the environment. Waste materials should be properly stored and handled to minimize the potential for a spill or impact to the environment.
